Tanya Barauskas Dorff, M.D., is an associate clinical professor in the Department of Medical Oncology & Therapeutics Research and serves as head of the genitourinary cancers program at City of Hope. Prostate cancer is the main focus of her clinical work and research, though she also cares for patients with kidney, bladder and penile cancer and collaborates on research projects to advance the care in these malignancies as well.

Dr. Dorff's research work has been published in Cancer, Clinical Cancer Research, Lancet Oncology and the Journal of Clinical Oncology. She has been invited to speak at multiple national and international meetings, and serves on the American Society of Clinical Oncology Scientific Committee, the NCCN (national comprehensive cancer network) guidelines panel for prostate cancer, and the National Cancer Institute Prostate Cancer Task Force.

Dr. Dorff has assumed control of a robust clinical trial portfolio for patients with prostate, bladder, and renal cancer and is collaborating with the experienced City of Hope immunotherapy program and the innovative basic scientists focused on prostate cancer to quickly translate promising new therapies to patients via clinical trials.
