Dr. Dorff graduated from UCLA School of Medicine and did her residency training at Mount Sinai in New York. During fellowship at USC she partnered with Dr. Jacek Pinski and developed a focus in genitourinary oncology.

Currently her research centers on translational clinical trials, including the study of combination therapy to overcome therapeutic resistance in advanced disease. In addition to conventional clinical trials, she is interested in the quality of life of cancer patients, which has led to collaborations with researchers in the school of Biokinesiology and the school of Gerontology incorporating dietary manipulation and exercise during standard treatment.

She is heavily involved in clinical research within her institution, supervising the GU clinical research team and serving as chair of the Quality Assurance Committee. Outside of her institution, she has enjoyed working with SWOG and the California Cancer Consortium to bring innovative treatments to her patients at USC.
